We don't expect that people would replace fresh flowers in their homes, but for those living in town who are not in residence permanently or have guest rooms that are not always in use, these flowers present a wonderful timesaving opportunity as a ready-made arrangement that can be moved around the house."

There is more too! Those with allergies can enjoy real flowers because the pollen is no longer present, so these flowers make a great eco alternative to faux flowers. A visit to the studio will show you that these flowers are delicate, vibrant and simply beautiful. Luke is a recycling expert and has saved tonnes of HiFi equipment, instruments and many other things from landfill and is heading up a division that will offer vintage and reclaimed vases, urns and other imaginative ways to display the flowers and be sustainable.
